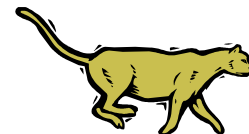

SCIENCE ACADEMY

On October 26th, Betsy Fritz, our Science Academy coordinator, led a hands-on science academy on Eerie Experiments. The kids made a Screaming Balloon from a hex nut, a balloon, and some centripetal force. They made Slime by mixing glue and borax to create cross-linked polymer. Finally, the Mad Scientist Pumpkin was very exciting, with an exothermic reaction of hydrogen peroxide and yeast flowing out of a jack o'lantern's eyes, nose, and mouth. The kids had a great time getting gooey and sticky while learning the scientific principles behind these exciting experiments.
